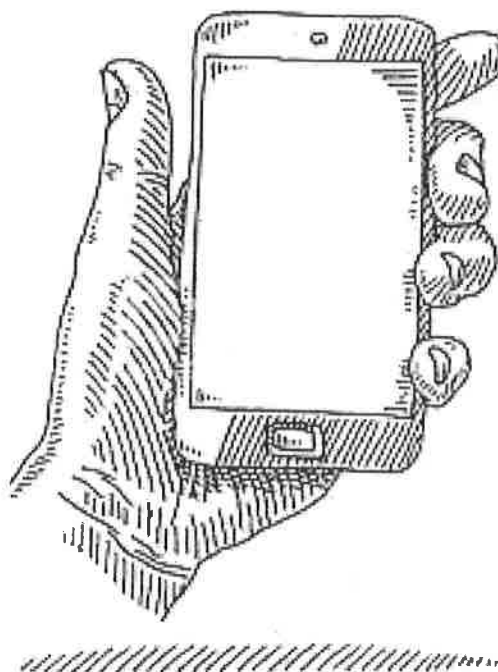


In the heart of Rosebank, Staten Island, the GMM is located in the historic home of the true inventor of the telephone, Antonio Meucci (and wife Esterre Meucci) including the legendary Italian hero, Giuseppe Garibaldi. The simple country residence was built circa 1840 in the Gothic revival style.

This museum offers guided historical tours, school programs, and culture classes to "preserve the past for the future."

We welcome you to the house of Antonio Meucci, the true inventor of the telephone and his house guest General Giuseppe Garibaldi. A study of Italian themed children's book: Strega Nona and Big Anthony. Includes literature and art.



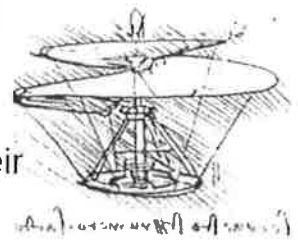
Immigrant Kids
